

Icons from Robert

Some of you will be aware that I am currently on a three-year course to learn how to paint Icons. This follow being on four Icon painting retreats when at the end of a week you come home with an Icon that you have painted. However, after four sessions I decided that I needed to know more, and my tutor agreed. So....I am now at the end of year one, of a three year course, and have created eight Icons over the last eight months. The final stage of creating an Icon is to have it blessed, therefore on some Wednesday Eucharists the priest at Harpsden has blessed the icons for me, and this last Sunday (22nd October) Sarah blessed my latest two Icons: St Michael and Our Lady of Perpetual Help.

Sue has taken a picture of these and they are here for you. But what do they mean?



St Michael - is shown with folded wings, holding a sceptre in his right hand to signify authority, and in his left hand he is holding a globe - this represents the Cosmos as Michael is the chief of all the Archangels and is given responsibility to keep humanity in order! Quite a tough job!



Our Lady of Perpetual Help shows Mary holding Jesus in her arms. Jesus is looking a bit alarmed as he has just spotted two Archangels who are holding up symbols of his Passion, so this is showing us that Jesus already knows what is ahead of him. But his earthly Mother, Mary is holding him tenderly in her arms and keeping him safe for as long as she can.


Sunday October 1st marked the beginning of a new Sunday school at St, Margaret's Church for the use of the whole Benefice. Shannon Masawi, who has agreed to help me two Sundays in the month, my daughter Rose, who is going to do Juice and biscuits and help generally, and I were very excited at the prospect of a new beginning, a fresh start. It has been a great many years since I ran the Sunday school along with Jo Taylor but now my Children have grown up and I am on the last months of homeschooling my last two children, and after learning that there were people asking for a Sunday school, am back in the most delightful job in the world; working with small children doing God's work. We have started quite small but I know we shall grow as we did before. Thirty-six children were on the Sunday school roll then.

The first week was about setting up getting to know each other and talking about, how as Christians, we should let our light shine and a discussion of what that means. The Children were given Attendance sticker books, with the incentive of a gift for the most regular attendance. We are keeping a Sunday School attendance register. We sang hymns and Choruses and now have our own Sunday school prayer which we will start every gathering with.

The following week was the 8th October. We spent time talking about what God was like. It is very difficult for small children to pray to someone who is their Father in Heaven when they can't see Him. We talked about what Jesus said to His disciples when they asked him what God was like and He said "If you see me, you see the Father". We discussed this and talked about what we knew about Jesus. The children were given work books and stuck handouts in the books and drew and illustrated the things in the world around them that they saw God in.

This week 15th of October we looked at our Baptism and its significance. Most children have no memory of their Baptism let alone its significance. The following week there is a Baptism in Church: hopefully they can see it and understand more of what the sacrament means. Thereafter, onwards and upwards. I warmly invite any children in our Benefice to Join us. We are having lots of fun, singing with the guitar, art and craft work and just being together in fellowship, so do come along from 9.30 onwards every Sunday.
