To Epiphany and beyond...!

...with apologies to Buzz Lightyear from 'Toy Story' for adapting his catchphrase.

Journeying into the heartlands of Christ's kingdom isn't always an easy or straightforward route to follow; it may take us into territory we'd rather avoid. The magi who followed a star that rose in the west above Bethlehem, and whose arrival we celebrate at Epiphany, might well have wondered where on earth they were going, travelling the trade routes across the mountains and deserts of Persia or Arabia carrying their gifts.

As I journey towards my departure from this benefice to become the Team Rector of the Wallingford benefice, I feel this tension, that the path with Christ isn't always easy, or what we expect, and yet we follow Christ's star, Christ's light. It is a time of wondering. There is so much happening here, so many exciting plans and opportunities that I know God will entrust to the safe and capable hands of others as I am called to move on.

In Matthew 7:13-14, Jesus said to the crowds, 'Enterthrough the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the road is easy that leads to destruction, and there are many who take it. For the gate is narrow and the road is hard that leads to life, and there are few who find it.' Taking the narrow gate is our invitation from Jesus into life in its fullness, life with Christ, but it's not easy. It requires commitment and consistency, which may well mean self-denial. This is what the 'narrow gate' demands. "Father...yet, not my will but yours be done" (Jesus on the Mount of Olives).

Sarah Rowland Jones, Dean of St David's, Wales, reflects on these verses; 'Living as a citizen of this kingdom means far more than just brandishing what seems to be an appropriate passport when it's convenient for us. 'Not everyone who says to me "Lord, Lord", will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only one who does the will of my father in heaven.' (Matthew 7:21). It takes more than this to pass the citizenship test, and even this is not just a matter of knowing the rules or passing an exam.

Taking the narrow gate requires sacrifice. Leaving behind things, people, places that fill us with joy and help us to flourish. I have received such support in this benefice and been allowed to grow and be fruitful over the past six years since I first sat quietly in a pew at Harpsden considering a potential curacy here. This branch of the vine is now being transplanted, and that is painful. However, the fruitfulness that you have so generously enabled means I will take my gifts and share them with others as we continue to grow Christ's kingdom on earth.

Jesus walks this journey with us. He doesn't just hand out a map and tell us to get on with it. He walks with us, leading us forward, and has the necessary provisions and even equipment, for us to keep on journeying. We just have to ask. I have been reading about Samara Levy, a stay-at-home mother from Brighton who heard Jesus call her to serve the refugees in Syria (thank you for the book loan, Jean). She writes about the hard lessons of learning to ask and to wait on God for what seemed impossible. In 2014 God called her three times to 'start

collecting' aid to send to the Middle East. Having previously had no experience in this area, but with her heart moved, Samara's vision to fill one lorry with clothing and other supplies



to Iraq soon evolved into an extraordinary operation sending over one hundred containers and lorries of aid to the Middle East, as well as providing a number of medical facilities in Syria. To date, she has distributed aid to more than 350,000 people in the Middle East and her work continues; a new medical centre is planned for 2024. Her book 'Rebuilding the Ruins: Following God's call to serve Syria' is worth reading (available here: https://www.samarasaidappeal.org/books).

So, as I journey to Epiphany and beyond, celebrating Candlemas* with you as my last service before I leave, I thank you with all my heart for everything that you have given me. I pray that you will continue to

flourish in God's name, building His kingdom here on earth in this benefice in whatever way He calls you to do. Continue to bring your gifts, share your talents and resources generously and walk the path through that narrow gate along which Christ leads you with love, joy and hope.

Tips to avoid being scammed

- 1. Be cautious and listen to your instincts. Do not be afraid to hand up, bin it, delete it, or shut the door. It is your home, your phone line, your email, your life you have a right to say and do NOTHING.
- 2. Say no to ALL online/doorstep/phone requests to money/Amazon vouchers etc even if they claim to be from a charity or friend/family member. If you are worried, contact the person mentioned at a known and trusted phone number, using a different phone or even better go and speak to the person face to face.
- 3. If you are on-line, be aware of fake news and use trusted sources such as gov.uk or NHS.uk websites. Make sure you type the addresses into your computer yourself DO NOT click on links in emails.
- 4. Only purchase goods from legitimate retailers and take a moment to think before parting with your money, or personal information. DO NOT be rushed by special offers or timed countdowns for special offers expiring soon.
- 5. Scammers also ask for payment for (fake) deliveries. DO NOT pay extra fees for deliveries unless it is a trusted company who have contacted you i.e. The Post Office etc but even then be careful as some scammers proport to be the Post Office.
- 6. Know who you are dealing with. If a name is mentioned, contact the named person yourself or if they say that they are HMRC, TV licencing, or a Utility Company, hang up and phone or email the known trusted address/number that you have yourself **BUT** use a different phone line to do so scammers often keep the phone line open so that you think you are calling a new outside number. If you only have one phone then put the phone down, pick it up and phone a friend before trying to contact HMRC etc as the scammer cannot then pretend to be your known friend. Keep trying different friends until you get to speak to one of them as the scammers will make you think that your friends' number is engaged.
- 7. Protect your financial information. <u>NEVER EVER EVER</u> give your bank/credit card details or PIN to anybody who contacts you online or on the phone. Scammers regularly pretend to be your bank/fraud investigators or even the Police to panic you. <u>The legitimate people will NEVER</u> ask for your PIN number under any circumstance.

If you do get scammed TELL SOMEBODY you trust and get advice.

It is NOT your fault.
